Commitment to Ohio's Public Lands & Equine Industry

OHC Membership maintains the trails they ride. In 2022, volunteers provided:

- ◆ Labor hrs. 16,558 @ \$29.95/hr = \$495,918.
- ◆ Equipment hrs. 5,507 @ \$25/hr = \$137,688.
- ◆ Material expense \$11,252
- ♦ Volunteer Value to the State of Ohio = \$644,858
- The public lands where the most work was completed include: Mohican Memorial State Forest, Alum Creek State Park and Van Buren State Park.
- OHC members enjoy riding Ohio's trails and rode more than 265,000 miles.
- The public lands where the mileage was acquired include: Hocking State Forest, Oak Openings Metro park, Mohican Memorial State Forest and South Chagrin Reservation in CLE Metro Parks.
