Ohio Horseman's Council Foundation Donation Instructions for OHC Chapters When Receiving Monetary or Materials Donations

The Ohio Horseman's Council Foundation (OHC Foundation) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that can accept charitable donations.

A charitable donation is defined as a gift of cash or materials/goods made to a nonprofit organization to help the organization accomplish its mission, for which the donor receives nothing of monetary value in return.

The mission of the OHC Foundation is to operate exclusively for the promotion of social welfare, charitable, educational and recreational purposes, to:

- Provide resources to promote the building and maintenance of bridle trails throughout the State of Ohio;
- Provide financial resources and volunteer services to fellow organizations that support and protect equine-related activities; and
- Provide support to state and national horse-related issues.

Instructions:

- 1) Monetary donation to the OHC Chapter
 - a) Check shall be made out to the Ohio Horseman's Council Foundation.
 - b) Check shall not be deposited into the Chapter's banking account but rather sent to the OHC Foundation.
 - c) The check, donor contact information (name, mailing address and email) and description of its intended use must be sent directly to the OHC Foundation:

- d) Upon receipt of donor's check, the OHC Foundation shall deposit the donor's check into the OHC Foundation bank account.
- e) Once the check has been processed and cleared, the OHC Foundation shall submit to the Chapter's Treasurer a check in the full amount and a form for the Treasurer to sign and return to the OHC Foundation acknowledging receipt of the check. The OHC Foundation shall also send to the donor a 501(c)(3) Organization Donation Receipt. Only the OHC Foundation shall issue Organization Donation Receipts. If a check is made out to the Chapter or a cash donation is given to the Chapter, the same steps as listed above shall be followed with the following exception: The Chapter shall make a photocopy of the check for record keeping and then deposit the check/cash in the Chapter's banking account and send a check in the full amount made out to the Ohio Horseman's Council Foundation. The OHC Foundation will issue a check in the full amount to the chapter.
- f) The Chapter shall maintain a receipt file for all expenditures of monetary donations. If the donation is for a specific project, the Chapter shall notify the OHC Foundation either by regular mail or email when the project is completed. A report shall be filed with the OHC Foundation at the end of the project. This report should document all expenses.
- g) The use of these funds on all purchases of materials/goods and selected services has a sales and use tax exemption in the State of Ohio. Below is the Ohio Department of Taxation STEC B form "Sales and Use Tax Blanket Exemption Certificate". The form is partially completed with OHC information. The form shall be signed and dated by a Chapter Officer and given to the vendor at time of purchase. A copy shall be maintained by the Chapter. The form below can be printed or you can locate a fillable form by clicking on the following; https://procure.ohio.gov/static/pdf/ST STEC B Fl.pdf. Some vendors might request the IRS W-9 form. Below is the the IRS W-9 form "Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification". The form is partially completed with OHC information. The form shall be signed and dated by a Chapter Officer and given to the vendor at time of purchase. A copy shall be maintained by the Chapter. - 2) Donation of Materials/Goods to the OHC Chapter

- a) Any materials/goods donated by others can include but not limited to lumber, gravel, hardware or any other type of material for a specific project.
- b) When the materials/goods have been received by the Chapter, the Chapter shall send to the OHC Foundation the donor's name, mailing address, email and a description of the materials/goods and any receipts or estimates detailing value of the materials/goods:

- c) The OHC Foundation will send the donor a 501(c)(3) Organization Donation Receipt. Only the OHC Foundation shall issue Organization Donation Receipts.
- d) Upon completion of the project where donor's materials/goods donation was used, the Chapter shall notify the OHC Foundation by regular mail or by email.

Note: Use of the "Sales and Use Tax Blanket Exemption Certificate" and the "Request for Taxpayer Identification Number and Certification" is only for OHC Chapter use and not for personal or individual use. Be advised that misuse of this form is a misdemeanor in the State of Ohio.

An individual or entity (Form W-9 requester) who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer

information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) which may be your social security number (SSN), individual taxpayer identification number (ITIN), adoption taxpayer identification number (ATIN), or employer identification number (EIN), to report on an information return the amount paid to you, or other amount reportable on an information return. Examples of information returns include, but are not limited to, the following.

• Form 1099-INT (interest earned or paid)

- Form 1098 (home mortgage interest), 1098-E (student loan interest), 1098-T (tuition)
- Form 1099-C (canceled debt)
- Form 1099-A (acquisition or abandonment of secured property)

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN.

If you do not return Form W-9 to the requester with a TIN, you might be subject to backup withholding. See What is backup withholding, later.
